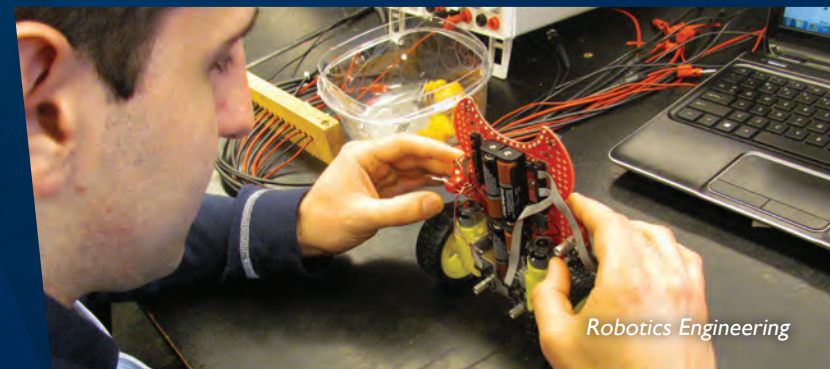

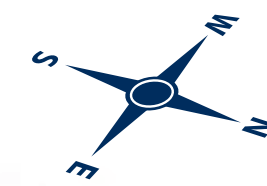
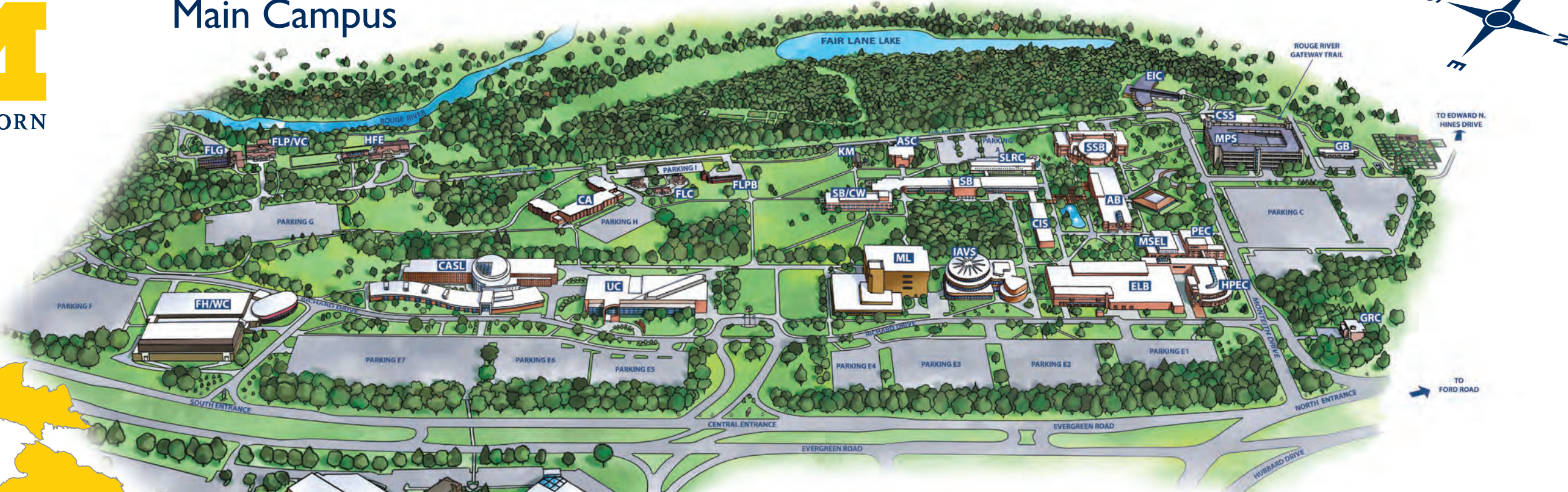
Have Fun in the Victors' Den

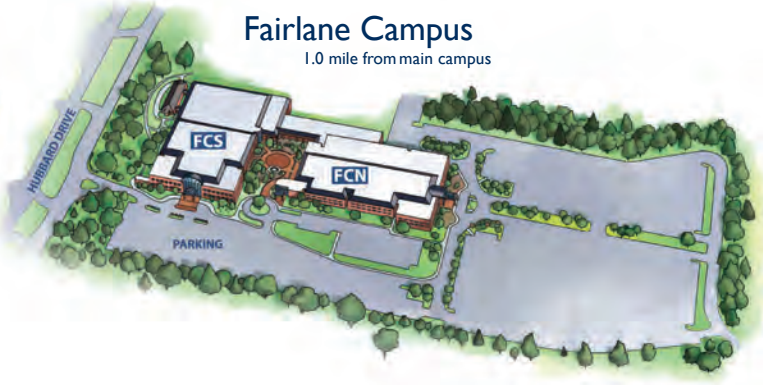

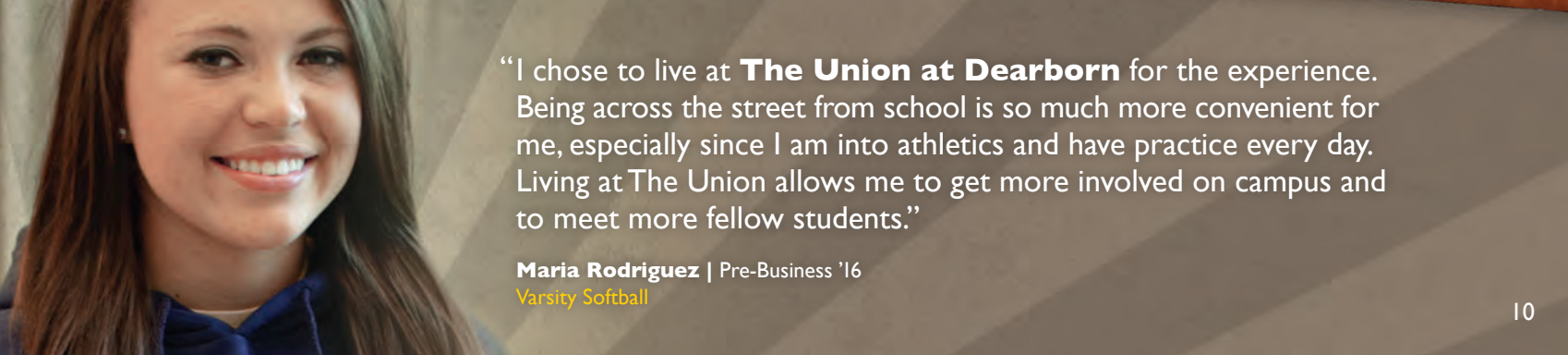
