Housing and Dining

- Central Campus apartments are fully furnished except for cookware, eating utensils, TVs, and linens. Both one-bedroom apartments and two-bedroom suite apartments will be available.
- Most Residence Halls on West Campus offer single and double rooms with community bathrooms. There are communal kitchens, common rooms, and study rooms available for student use.
- Meal Plan or Flex (funds on deposit to use for dining facilities, merchants-on-points, and all Duke stores).

FLEX

- Flex is a pre-paid flexible spending account. Once you open an account, it is linked to your DukeCard.
- It allows you to use your DukeCard to pay for textbooks, school supplies, laundry services, vending machines, food at campus eateries, and many other services on campus.
