Personal statement/essay

Equivalency grade point average of 3.2 on a 4.0 scale

Official college transcript

Undergraduate applicants must have reached the status of sophomore, junior, senior or the equivalent

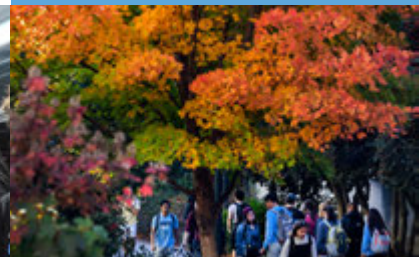
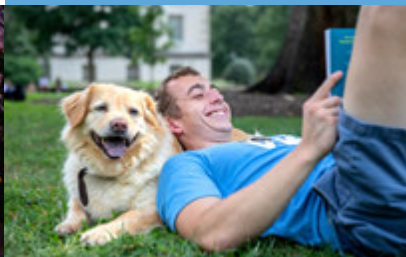
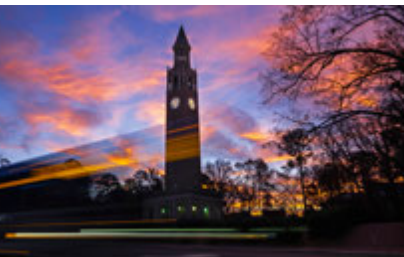


Required biographical, housing, and other enrollment information as requested

English language proficiency with a minimum score of 90 on the TOEFL iBT, a minimum score of 600 on the TOEFL PBT, or a band score of 6.5 or higher on the IELTS

2 academic letters of recommendations

Letter of approval from the home university's international office or equivalent

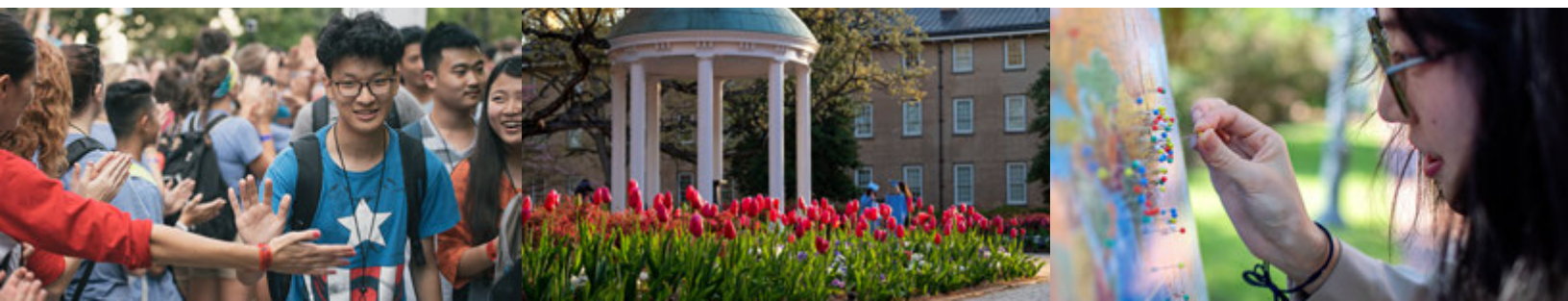
