Course Objective／授業の目的と概要	<p>This course provides students with an introduction to the South Asian languages, especially of Indo-Aryan language family in the Indian subcontinent.</p> <p>By the end of this course students will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. gain knowledge about Indo-Aryan languages including Hindi dialects; 2. understand the complicated situation of languages in Indian subcontinent. <p>Students are expected to have gained foundational knowledge and skills in the discipline of linguistics before attempting this course.</p> <p>Week: 1-8 ('Indo-Aryan: a bird's eye view' and discussion) Week: 9-10 ('"Language" vs. "dialect" in the Indo-Aryan context' and discussion) Week: 11-12 ('Hindi and Urdu' and discussion) Week: 13-14 ('Nomenclature' and discussion) Week: 15 (Feedback: Discussion and presentation)</p> <p>Note: The schedule may change in accordance with the students' level of comprehension. Classes will be held online later in the semester (8th to 14th).</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pre-class preparation is essential for class participation. Students are expected to read the textbook and to understand the content BEFORE the class. 2. Students should read relative books on written in Japanese as needed. <p>Colin P. Masica. The Indo-Aryan Languages. Cambridge University Press, 1991. Handouts will be provided in class accordingly.</p> <p>George Cardona and Chanes Jain (ed.). The Indo-Aryan Languages. Routledge, 2003.</p> <p>Other reference materials for the course may be announced in class as needed.</p> <p>Evaluation (100%) will be based on daily attendance and active participation in discussion (30%) and also on the mid-term and the final exams (70%). Attendance is essential in this class.</p> <p>NOTE: The final exams can be replaced with several mini exams depending on the situation.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If a student has a valid excuse for missing an examination and wants to take a makeup exam, he/she must communicate with the office of academic affairs of the Faculty. Make-up exams will be given only in case of an emergency or unavoidable problems such as personal illness (requires verification). 2. Attendance only is not sufficient for earning credit for 30% of the total evaluation. If a student comes to class late without a valid excuse, he/she will be deducted 0.5 percent of his/her grade at the end of the course. <p>Students who have missed more than 5 lessons will not be graded, even if you take an examination. Students should notify the instructor in advance if they have good and acceptable reasons for a long absence (more than 5 weeks). In order to prevent the spread of the novel coronavirus infections, classes can be offered online. I will inform you of the details later on through KOAN, LoLoNote School, and so on.</p>
