Language of the Course	Japanese
Type of Class	Lecture Subject
Course Objective	This course provides students with an introduction to Hindi traditional grammar and technical terms used in it.
Learning Goals	By the end of this course students will be able to: 1. gain knowledge about Hindi traditional grammar; 2. understand specific technical terms used in Hindi (or Indian) traditional grammar. 3. have a viewpoint of comparative/contrastive language studies.
Requirement / Prerequisite	Students who successfully completed the primary and intermediate Hindi courses (or equivalent) will be eligible to attempt this course. In addition, they are expected to have completed a general linguistic course before attempting this course.
Class Plan	Week: 1 (Introduction to language and script) Week: 2-4 (Phonological system and writing system) Week: 5-8 (Words-1: sangyaa, sarvnaam, visheshan, avyay, kaarak) Week: 9-10 (Types of sentences: simple, compound, and complex) Week: 11-14 (Words-2: padkram, arth, kriyaa, vachan, ling) Week: 15 (Feedback) Note: The schedule may change in accordance with the students' level of comprehension.
Independent Study Outside of Class	1. Pre-class preparation is essential for class participation. Students are expected to read the textbook and to understand the content BEFORE the class. 2. Students should read relative books on written in Japanese as needed.

Attendance only is not sufficient for earning credit for 30% of the total evaluation. If a student comes to class late without a valid excuse, he/she will be deducted 0.5 percent of his/her grade at the end of the course.
